Winter School Parent & Student Information

Northwood High School will offer winter school in select courses for current students in grades 9-12. Winter school is for students needing to recover credit in a course that they are predicted to fail; it is not for students wanting to take a course for the first time. Students will work at their own pace to complete the course using Apex Learning or teacher-designed materials. Teachers will be monitoring and assisting students. Students should reach out to their counselor for advice on which course they should take to ensure they are taking the right course needed for promotion and graduation. There will be no fee for Winter School. Please note that Winter School will be virtual and not face-to-face. If you need paper packets for Winter School, please let us know ahead of time. Registration for Winter School will close on December 30th, 2020 at 5:00 pm.

Attendance:

- **All students enrolled in winter school will be completing credit recovery courses online through at-home learning.**
- Winter school teachers will be available during their winter school office hours to monitor and assist students via Zoom, via phone or e-mail. Office hours will be determined by each individual teacher and will fall between 2 pm - 9 pm.

Conduct

Students are expected to adhere to all rules and policies outlined in the Northwood Student Handbook and the Chatham County Schools Code of Student Conduct. Failure to meet these expectations may result in removal from winter school.

Grades

Credit Recovery is for students who are predicted to fail a course based on their predicted FINAL grade at the midterm progress report for T3. Students will earn a grade of Pass or Fail for the course and the grade will not be factored into the student's GPA.
